The Yocum Library has 50,000+ books and DVDs that you can check out of the library.

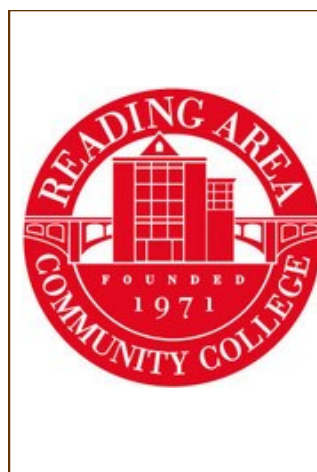
The Yocum Library has the largest collection of DVDs in the area including feature films from around the world, TV series, and documentaries.

The Yocum Library has 50+ online databases that contain thousands of e-books, magazines, newspapers, journals, streaming music and video, and historical primary documents. RACC students have access on and off campus to most databases. Off campus access usernames & passwords are found in your RACC portal under Student Resources. Some popular databases include:

### ProQuest Central

includes current events, humanities, business, social science, science, and health sources databases.

### The New York Times

provides free access to the *New York Times* for RACC students/staff/faculty.

### The Naxos Music Library

includes 1.5 million + tracks of classical, world, jazz, and rock music selections with CD quality sound. Please log off after you have finishing listening to allow access to others.

### Hoopla

includes 300,000+ streaming music, books, audio recordings, and television episodes.

### Ancestry.com

provides access to the Library edition of the popular family history website. RACC librarians offer workshops and individual help for patrons researching their family trees.

The Yocum Library provides current RACC students, staff, and faculty access to 40+ computers, printers, photocopiers, and a scanning document station. The Library staff includes a Library Technology Specialist—Mr. David Pennypacker.
