PROGRAM NARRATIVE

The Practical Nurse Program (LPN) is a one-year, full-time day certification program. LPNs practice under the supervision of a Registered Nurse, licensed physician or licensed dentist. The Practical Nurse Program prepares the student to provide direct nursing care with a holistic approach. Career options for Licensed Practical Nurses include positions in long-term care and assisted living facilities, doctors offices, schools, industry, home health, rehabilitation, insurance and pharmaceutical companies. Coursework will aid students in preparing to take the State Board of Nursing National Council Licensing Exam for Practical Nurses (NCLEX-PN).

- This is a daytime program.
- Students must be available Monday-Friday between the hours of 6:30am-4:30pm.
- Student transportation is required and must be arranged at a student's own expense.
- This program combines classroom, lecture, lab, and clinical hours.
- Schedules are subject to change each semester.
- This program is accredited by the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN) and approved by the Pennsylvania State Board of Nursing.
- A grade of C+ or better is required for PNP101, PNP102, & PNP103.

 - vi. Minimum cumulative GPA 2.5
- All above requirements must be completed by August 15
- A petition form must be submitted through MyRACC-Self Service
- Admission Notifications are distributed by August 30 through student email

CLINICAL COMPLIANCE DOCUMENTATION & REQUIREMENTS REQUIRED UPON ACCEPTANCE

- Clear State, Federal (FBI), and Child Abuse History required.
- Completed Physical Form which demonstrates evidence of the essential abilities/qualities of a professional nursing student.
- Evidence of a negative drug/alcohol panel.
- Evidence of specific immunizations/antibody titers.
- Evidence of current CPR Certification for the Healthcare Provider by the American Heart Association.
- Evidence of current health insurance.

ADDITIONAL PRACTICAL NURSING PROGRAM POLICIES & ADVISING NOTES

- Only one readmission is permitted to the licensed practical nursing program and must occur within one year of program withdrawal. Please refer to student re-admission policies for further information.
- PNP109 & PNP111 must be completed within the last five (5) years.
- TEAS exam must be completed within the last two (2) years.
