PROGRAM NARRATIVE

The AAS program in Respiratory Care prepares graduates to work in hospitals, rehabilitation and skilled nursing facilities, patients' homes, and physician offices to assess and treat patients with breathing disorders. Respiratory Care students participate in diverse classroom, laboratory, and clinical experiences in the Berks, Chester, Lancaster, Lebanon, Northampton, Montgomery, Schuylkill and Lehigh counties. The laboratory portion prepares students for hands-on work in real-world patient care.

- Respiratory skills to provide treatment, assessment, diagnostic evaluation, and care to patients with cardiac (heart) and pulmonary (lung) disease processes
- Chronic, acute and critical care concepts across the lifespan
- Professionalism, leadership and communication

PROGRAM INFORMATION

- This is a daytime program.
- Student transportation is required and must be arranged at a student's own expense.
- RES courses involve a combination of classroom, lecture, lab, and clinical hours.
- Respiratory schedules are subject to change each semester.
- This program is accredited by the Commission on Accreditation for Respiratory Care (CoARC).
- A grade of C or better is required for progression for ALL RES courses.
- This program is a competitive entrance major and follows selective admission criteria as provided below.

CLINICAL COMPLIANCE DOCUMENTATION & REQUIREMENTS NEEDED UPON PROGRAM ADMISSION SELECTION

- Clear State, Federal (FBI), and Child Abuse History required.
- Completed Physical Form which demonstrates evidence of the Essential Abilities/Qualities of a professional respiratory student.
- Evidence of a negative drug/alcohol panel.
- Evidence of specific immunizations/antibody titers.
- Evidence of current CPR Certification for the Healthcare Provider by the American Heart Association.
- Evidence of current health insurance.

ADDITIONAL PROGRAM POLICIES & ADVISING NOTES

- All required prerequisites and general education courses must be completed with a “C” or better.
- Only one readmission is permitted to the respiratory program and must occur within one year of program withdrawal. Please refer to student Re-Admission Policies for further information.
- BIO250/BIO255- A&P I & II must be completed within the last 5 years to meet program entry requirements.
- TEAS exam must be completed within the last 2 years to meet program entry requirements.
