

Phlebotomy

The Phlebotomy program will prepare individuals to collect blood from adult patients. The initial component of training will consist of basic health care skills, medical terminology and pre-clinical training. The second component will consist of 80 hours of clinical training. Daytime or evening classes available.

How long does it take to complete?

The program is broken up into two 6-week modules, plus a hands-on 80 hour internship.

What does this program cost?

The cost for the program is \$2190.00.

Are there additional costs?

Yes. You will be responsible for the cost of books and supplies which includes the purchase of scrubs and appropriate shoes. Estimated fees \$550.00.

Is financial aid available?

No. Financial aid is not available for this program.

Are there scholarships?

Yes! You can apply for the Mae W. Langan Scholarship. Scholarship applicants must complete the free application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) for your application to be considered.

What classes will I take?

The first 6-week module consists of Workplace Success, Health Care Skills I, Medical Terminology I & Anatomy, & Basic Life Support. *80.5 hours*.

The second 6-week module consists of Medical Terminology II & Anatomy, Pre-Clinical Phlebotomy I, and Pre-Clinical Phlebotomy II. *72 hours*.

The third module consists of your internship. *80 hours*.
